- I. Meeting to be called to order – 6:15PM, no area members present, board member Daisy Chavez, asked to serve as part of Neighborhood Committee. (11 community members present)
- II. Welcome and roll call – brief introductions of Neighborhood Committee goals.
- III. General Public Comment (Limited to 2 minutes per speaker) **[6 min]**

The public may provide comments to the board on non-agenda items within the Neighborhood Council's subject matter jurisdiction. However, please note that under the Brown Act, the board is prevented from acting on the issue you bring to its attention until the matter is agendaized for discussion at a future public meeting.

  1. S.S.- asking for assistance on how to move Metro bus stop on State St./freeway on ramp to State St./Sheridan St. due to ongoing car accidents near freeway entrance/exit. Unsafe location for pedestrians. Referred to Metro Planning team.
- IV. Discussion and possible action to identify Neighborhood Committee top priorities for 2016-2017 [5 min]- Item tabled to next meeting for Area Officers to report.
- V. Discussion and review of [Clean Streets LA Challenge](#) application submitted[5min]
  - a. Description: In partnership with the Board of Public Works and Los Angeles Sanitation, neighborhood councils have the opportunity to partner with local community organizations to submit for a grant from a \$25,000 pot, in this citywide campaign.
  - b. Collaborators: Councilmember Jose Huizar's Office, Proyecto Pastoral  
Public Comment: S.C. & A.C- interested in promoting challenge and helping BHNC. K.S. & A.M.- interested in learning about dates and possible participation opportunities.  
Committee Action: Upcoming dates listed as 10/15, 10/29 & 11/12 from 9-2pm, announced recent determination from the Board of Public Works and Los Angeles Sanitation, BHNC will be eligible to receive \$1,250 if goals are met, with the possibility of extending award if goals are exceeded. Flyers with additional details will be emailed to community members for additional information. Encouraged participation and sharing of event among community members. Committee will update board on application status. Approved (2-0-0).
- VI. Discussion to identify small asphalt repairs for the Bureau of Street Services [5min]
  - a. Description: The Bureau of Street Services scheduled a Small Asphalt Repairs (SAR) truck for the Boyle Heights Neighborhood Council district to preform small asphalt repairs on 10/27/16. Top 15 nominations for consideration will be discussed. Deadline to submit completed form 10/20/16.  
Public Comment: S.C- deep sinking pothole on Soto St. (near Sinclair gasoline station), two major potholes on Wabash (near Fickett & Soto – close to Que Rico! Restaurant), potholes near McDonald's (near Soto/ Chavez), and Marengo (near Daly/Lourde/Mission).  
Committee Action: List of request will be emailed and circulated with Area Officers before opening to the public for additional recommendations. Public comment recommendations will be considered for submission. Approved (2-0-0).
- VII. Discussion and possible discussion to draft a Community Impact Statement regarding: Council File: 16-0888 Motion Relative to Addressing Issues of Marijuana Advertisement. [10min]
  - a. Description: This motion highlights the need to prepare to address the issue of marijuana advertising if Proposition 64 is approved by California voters in November. The upcoming statewide marijuana ballot initiative could allow TV commercials promoting pot to air alongside

advertisements for cleaning products. Motion is requesting that the City Attorney report on options for prohibiting the advertisement of marijuana if recreational use is approved by the voters in November, including a discussion of what the City currently does to prohibit alcohol and cigarette advertising. <Maria C. – arrived to meeting at 6:38pm>

PUBLIC COMMENT: S.C- If approved, marijuana should have the same restrictions as alcohol and smoking. A.C- good that BHNC is going to be proactive. S.S.- should be treated the same, social media will act as advertisement for it but if we can limit billboards and airtime, and proximity to school, it would be best. K.S.-should receive the same advertisement restrictions. R.S.- smoking should not be normalized and it shouldn't be advertised near children.

Committee Action: D.C.- limitations should be placed. M.C-should have the same restrictions. A lot of controversy of health issues regarding smoking marijuana, and it should be limited.

Consensus from Neighborhood Committee for CIS to state: if passed by voters, marijuana should be limited in the same way alcohol and smoking is, with additional restrictions to prevent renormalization of smoking, especially around children/youth. Approved for board consideration (3-0-0).

- VIII. Discussion and possible action to draft a Community Impact Statement regarding Council File 14-0366-S5 relative to Proposition D, Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Adult Use of Medical Marijuana Act. [10min]
- a. Description: This motion is instructing the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) and the City Administrative Office (CAO) to report back with options for a March 2017 ballot measure that will allow Prop D compliant dispensaries to conform to the newly created medical marijuana state licensing system, increase penalties and enforcement to close down all illegal marijuana related business, create a regulatory framework for the City to implement the Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA) if approved in November, and extend Prop D's gross receipts tax to all marijuana related businesses.  
Public Comment: E.N.-marijuana should not be allowed to grow in commercial warehouses. S.C.- current limit is 5 plants? All business more than this should be considered illegal. A.C.- they should opt of delivering marijuana.  
Committee Action- Review Colorado for current guidelines. Tabled for next meeting to get additional information and possible presenter (3-0-0).
- IX. Discussion and possible action to improve Community Improvement Project process Increase number of applications; provide guidance for applicants on process. [5 min] item tabled to next meeting for Area Officers to report.

- VII. Discusión y posible debate para redactar una Declaración de Impacto de la Comunidad en relación con: Archivo Consejo: 16-0.888 Movimiento relativo a abordar las cuestiones de la marihuana Publicidad. [10 minutos]
  - a. Descripción: Este movimiento pone de relieve la necesidad de prepararse para hacer frente a la cuestión de la publicidad marihuana si la Proposición 64 es aprobada por los votantes de California en noviembre. La próxima iniciativa de votación en todo el estado de la marihuana podría permitir a los anuncios de televisión la promoción de la marihuana al aire junto a la publicidad de productos de limpieza. El movimiento se solicita que el informe fiscal de la ciudad sobre las opciones para prohibir la publicidad de la marihuana si el uso recreativo es aprobada por

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los votantes en noviembre, incluyendo una discusión de lo que la Ciudad hace actualmente para prohibir la publicidad del alcohol y el cigarrillo.

- VIII. Discusión y posible acción para redactar una Declaración de Impacto Comunidad referente al expediente 14-0366-S5 Consejo relativa a la Propuesta D, dispensarios de marihuana medicinal y el uso adulto de la Ley de Marihuana Medicinal. [10 minutos]
  - a. Descripción: Este movimiento está instruyendo al Jefe Analista Legislativo (CLA) y la Oficina Administrativa de la Ciudad (CAO) que informe con opciones para una medida electoral de marzo de 2017 que permitirá a los dispensarios que cumplen Prop D para ajustarse al sistema de licencia estatal de marihuana medicinal de nueva creación , aumentar las penas y la aplicación de cerrar todos los negocios ilegales relacionados con la marihuana, crear un marco regulador de la Ciudad para implementar el uso adulto de la Ley de marihuana (AUMA) si se aprueba en noviembre, y se extienden Prop D's impuesto a los ingresos a todos los negocios relacionados con la marihuana.
