



# Weekly Legislative Report

August 30, 2019

Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2019-2020 Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 127 (Wiener), Complete Streets for Active Living, which would make significant changes to Caltrans' programming, planning and capital improvement processes to incorporate complete street elements into projects in specified areas by providing safe mobility for all users.

The Resolution is requesting the City of Los Angeles to include in its 2019-2020 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 665 (Umberg), and any similar legislation that would authorize a county to use State funds to provide mental health services to individuals who are incarcerated in a county jail.

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**Council File 19-0002-S159, AB 1197 (Santiago) / Proposition HHH / Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) / Emergency Shelter Projects / California Environmental Quality Act Exemption:** Introduced on August 27, 2019 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. The Resolution is requesting the City of Los Angeles to include in its 2019-2020 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 11197 (Santiago), the California Environmental Quality Act Exemption, which exempts activities approved or carried out by the City in furtherance of supportive housing projects funded by Proposition HHH bond proceeds or emergency shelter projects funded by the Homeless Emergency Aid Program and Seek Amendment to apply the CEQA exemption to all permanent supportive housing projects.

The Resolution is requesting the City of Los Angeles to include in its 2019-2020 State Legislative Program SUPPORT or SPONSORSHIP of legislation to specify that Department of Developmental Services vendors in areas with a local minimum wage that is greater than the State minimum wage can seek an adjustment related specifically to the increase in the State minimum wage.
