Summary of Motions Introduced (*New Legislation*)

Council File 18-0610, Right to Counsel Ordinance / Program / Tenants Facing Eviction: Introduced on June 22, 2018 and referred to Housing Committee. The motion is instructing the Housing and Community Investment Department to work with the Chief Legislative Analyst and the City Attorney to develop recommendations, including prospective costs and funding sources, for a City of Los Angeles “right to counsel” ordinance and/or program to ensure that tenants have access to the information and representation they need when faced with alleged landlord harassment, rental agreement and lease issues, and eviction for any reason, and report back to the City Council within 120 days.

Council File 18-0592, Individual Development Account (IDA) Program / First Time Homebuyers Program / Feasibility Report: Introduced on June 20, 2018 and referred

to Housing Committee. Motion is instructing the Housing and Community Investment Department (HCID), with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) and the City Administrative Officer (CAO), to report on the feasibility of, and options for, creating an Individual Development Account (IDA) Program to be offered by the City of Los Angeles to complement its first time homebuyer programs.

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Council File 18-0002-S83, Net Neutrality / State and Federal Protection: Introduced on June 22, 2018, and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 Federal and State Legislative Program support for state and federal legislation that truly aims to protect “net neutrality” as it was intended in State Senate Bills 822 and 460.

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Council File 18-0002-S82, Immigrant Family Reunification / United States Justice Department / Zero-Tolerance Memorandum: Introduced on June 22, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-18 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for any family reunification legislation and / or action, including upholding the Flores settlement and amicus briefs that assist immigrant parents and / or minors held under the U.S. Justice Department’s “Zero-Tolerance” memorandum to be reunited with haste, including the estimated 100 minors here in Los Angeles.

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Council File 18-0002-S81, 2020 Census / Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) / Addresses Appeals Process: Introduced on June 22, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 Federal Legislative Program OPPOSITION to the proposed 2020 Census Local Update of Census Addresses Appeals Process, which would put an undue burden on the City's ability to challenge any addresses rejected by the Census Bureau, unless amended to include a preponderance of evidence standard.

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Council File 18-0002-S80, AB 813 (Holden) / California Independent System Operator / Multi-State Regional Transmission Organization: Introduced on June 22, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 State Legislative Program OPPOSITION for AB 813 (Holden) UNLESS AMENDED to ensure that the energy assets and clean energy objectives of non-participants of the multi-state Regional Transmission Operator (RTO) are not impacted, in any way, by the resource planning and procurement policies and objectives of the RTO inasmuch as they may interfere with the LADWP's critical investments in clean energy and greenhouse gas reductions.

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Council File 18-0002-S79, S 3036/ Keep Families Together Act / Prohibit

Separating Families at Border: Introduced on June 20, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for S 3036, which will prohibit border officials from separating families at the border.

Take Action:

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Council File 18-0002-S78, Keep Families Together Act (Feinstein) / Expedite Laws

/ Protect Children / Champion Human Rights: Introduced on June 20, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. The Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for any fast-tracked or expeditious action that may augment or help the passage of the Keep Families Together Act.

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Council File 18-0002-S77, SB 1346 (Jackson) / Multiburst Trigger Activator:

Introduced on June 29, 2018 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. The Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2017-2018 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 1346 (Jackson), which would clarify that the State's definition of a multiburst trigger activator includes bump fire stocks or bump fire attachments.
